



## **Guillaume Lecué**

Guillaume Lecué graduated from Ecole Normale Supérieure de Cachan, France, and received the M.Sc. degree in applied mathematics from Université Paris XI - Orsay, France, in 2005. He received the Ph.D. degree in statistics at Université Paris VI - Jussieu, France, in 2007. In 2008, he went to the Mathematical Science Institute in Canberra, Australia and later at the Technion, Haïfa, Israel as a Post-Doc. He completed his habilitation degree in 2008 at the Laboratoire d'analyse et mathématiques appliquées, Université Paris-Est Marne-la-vallée, France.

He is currently Chargé de Recherche at CNRS (national center for scientific research). His research interests are in the areas of learning theory, empirical process theory and high-dimensional phenomena. He taught at Ecole Polytechnique from 2012 to 2015 and now at ENSAE (the national school of administration and statistics), France.

Dr. Lecué received the "Mark Fulk award" for the best student paper at the 2006 Conference on Learning Theory, COLT06, Pittsburgh, PA and the "Prix de la chancellerie des Universités de Paris" for the best Ph.D. thesis in mathematics and its applications defended in Paris in 2007.
